Description

The side event will present new implementation efforts to strengthen urban rural linkages in relation to global normative agendas and showcase selected national and subnational experiences addressing inequality and poverty through integrated actions on sustainable food systems. The importance of integrating urban and rural development together, in fact helping urban-rural relations become more equal, more inclusive and balanced, underlies the SDG 11.a target and related provisions in the New Urban Agenda. These provisions call for urban and territorial planning solutions across the urban-rural continuum (across administrative boundaries; government levels; sectors and including all relevant actors). Speakers addressing these perspectives will highlight solutions for supporting governments at all levels on sustainable food systems aiming at addressing food insecurity and malnutrition while protecting biodiversity and responding to challenges posed by climate change (among others); towards reducing spatial inequalities in the urban-rural continuum. Speakers from national and local governments, UN agencies and Civil Society Organizations and City Networks are collaborating in multi-sector, multi-level approaches to support innovations at local and subnational levels through new inclusive food governance mechanisms that bring urban and rural together.

The event will focus on reducing the spatial inequalities in the urban-rural continuum through strengthening the linkage between urban and rural areas. Some of the linkages that will be discussed during the forum include food systems, biodiversity, climate change and others that are relevant for prosperity in both city and regions.




